Most Civil Service positions are competitive. Librarian applicants are rated by their training and experience. Join the OCPL team as a Librarian 1, a "continuous recruitment" position in the Onondaga County workforce with a salary range of \$44,522 to \$49,246 (2012).

County Personnel will accept your application (Form p-200) at any time. Download the application from the county Web site at www.ongov.net/Employment.

Applicants must have a graduate library degree from an accredited library school and a valid New York State Public Librarian's Professional Certificate from the New York State Education Department.

Comprehensive and Competitive Fringe Benefits

- **NYS Retirement:** Retirement benefits depend on length of service and salary. You become vested in just five years. NYS retirement is transferable to other NYS municipalities, including towns, villages, school districts, and state facilities.
- **Health Benefits:** The County offers a wide range of quality insurance options, including health, prescription drugs, dental, and vision plans. Your portion of the cost is minimal by today's standards.
- **Leave Benefits:** Leave includes six months unpaid leave for the birth of a child, up to 12 weeks unpaid family medical leave under the Family Medical Leave Act, a leave transfer program whereby County employees may donate vacation time to fellow coworkers who need time due to serious illness.
- **Holiday, Vacation, Personal, and Sick Leave Benefits:** Employees receive a generous amount of leave time, including vacation, personal, sick time, and holidays, as well as coverage under a long-term disability plan.
- **Job Security:** Onondaga County employees are protected by Civil Service Law and the bargaining unit agreement, providing stronger job protection than in the private sector.
