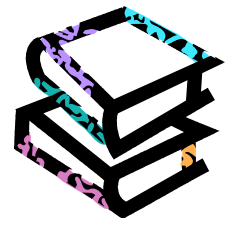

Wednesday, March 24 at 6:30 pm

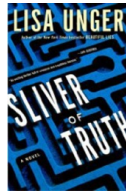
Children of all ages are invited to wear their PJs to the library for this special one hour program. There will be stories, music and other fun activities. Teddy bears are welcome too!

Meet the Local Author Alyn Ray Hoxie

Wednesday, March 10, at 6:30 pm

Syracuse native Alyn Ray Hoxie, a graduate of Corcoran and LeMoyne, lived for a time in the Valley in a house that was haunted. His new work of non-fiction – The Dollhouse – is about the house and the 13 people connected to it that all died within a 2-year span. Like the Amityville Horror, it is a true story, and every death can be accounted for in the local papers. Mr. Hoxie, an author and musician with 5 books and 3 CDs to his name, will discuss those years in the haunted house, which still stands. The book will be available at the program.
