## FOCL Author Series – Season 29: Neil Gaiman and Art Spiegelman Tuesday, May 7 7:30 p.m.

#### @ The Oncenter Crouse Hinds Theater

The unique duo are respected friends and will be in conversation to close out FOCL's 29<sup>th</sup> season. In 1992, Spiegelman won the Pulitzer Prize for his masterful Holocaust narrative *Maus*. He was elected a member of the American Academy of Arts and Letters and in 2018 received the Edward MacDowell Medal, the first-ever given in comic art. Gaiman makes a return to our series and is considered by many as one of the most celebrated writers of our time. His popular and critically acclaimed works bend genres while reaching audiences of all ages.
