Special Events in December

There were a trio of interesting events in the month of December. First was our Legislative Breakfast at the Westhill High School library on Dec 8th. Besides conversing with politicians like Assemblyman Stirpe and a representative with Governor Hochul, we were introduced to the students from the AP Government group at Westhill High School, who had a multimedia display dealing with legislative priorities for school libraries. It was an engaging group of 21 students who worked for 3 weeks on the project.







Our second event was the Social Dance at Central Library on Dec 16th. This was the culmination of Witness to Injustice program over the course of 2023. The dance on the 16th brought in examples of Native American artwork, Fry Bread for everyone to enjoy, and the Haudenosaunee singers and dancers performed for the audience of 60-65 people in the community room.





Finally, OCPL dominated the downtown landscape with our Window Wonderland display on our front window (still up, if you want to look at it). This was part of the 8th annual contest put on by the Downtown Committee of Syracuse. People voted on the best window display from 35 downtown businesses. Our incredible artists from Soule Branch, Amy Bader and Evan Milholland, created a window based on the book Narnia. Over 6000 people voted, and OCPL's window took first place. More than 800 people voted for our window, beating the second-place business by over 200 votes.
