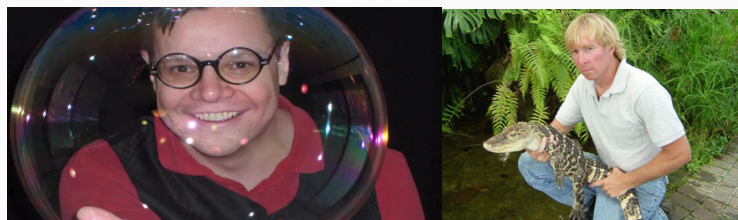

- 2) If you've participated in a past READsquared reading program through CLD&J you can log in with your username and password. Otherwise, select Register in the top right corner of the page.
- 3) Register for yourself or as a parent/guardian with other readers.

Log Reading

- 1) From your home screen select Logging from the left side menu.
- 2) Choose Log Reading.
- 3) Enter how many minutes you read along with the Book Title and Author.
- 4) Hit Submit! You will earn 1 point for every minute you read!

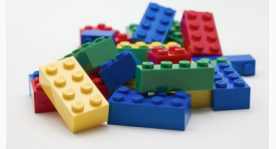

Qigong

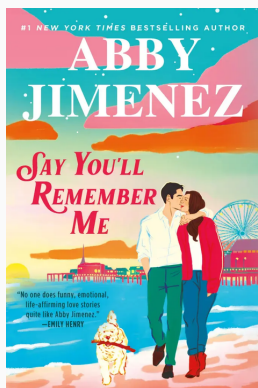

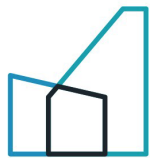

- A valid, government issued photo ID for each person.
- The document without any signatures.

The notary will verify your identities, witness the signing of the document, and notarize it when complete.
