Summer Reading Program 2023

Pre-K Program

This program is designed for kids ages birth to 5 years old. Kids will earn one raffle ticket for every 30 minutes of reading during the program. Reading includes being read to by family members, friends, or the narrator of audiobooks! Additional raffle entries can be earned for completing activities and attending online programs. Participants can earn weekly prizes by spending at least 30 minutes with a book and stopping into the library.

Children's Program

Home Delivery for Homebound Patrons

The CLD&J offers free Home Delivery Service for eligible individuals residing in the CLD&J's service area, which encompasses the Jamesville-DeWitt school district. Deliveries are made on a monthly basis. The program is for individuals with a valid Onondága County Public Library Card who meet the following criteria: senior citizen non-drivers; those with long term illnesses or disabilities unable to travel to the library; those with short term illnesses or disabilities unable to travel to the library; and/or new parents for the first six months after childbirth.
