**TALKING TURTLE STORIES W/ PERRY GROUND**

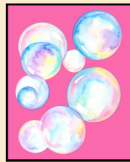

Kids join Ms. Joyce for a creative cardboard session where you construct your own cardboard character with moving parts! Pre-registration appreciated.

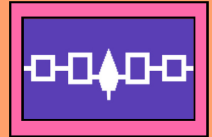

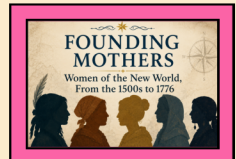

Historical interpreter Renee-Noelle Felice looks at the Indigenous, European, and African women whose courage and contributions helped shape early America from the 1500s through 1776.

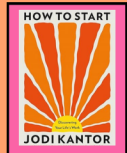

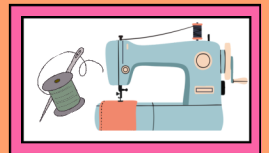
